Professor Lina Pelliccione is the inaugural Pro-Vice Chancellor of Curtin Mauritius and commenced her role in January 2019. Prior to this role Professor Pelliccione held a number of senior positions at Curtin University since she began in a full-time capacity in 2001. Professor Pelliccione was the Head of the School of Education since 2010 prior to taking up the role of Deputy Pro-Vice Chancellor of the Faculty of Humanities in February, 2018. She was selected to attend a number of prestigious courses such as the Harvard Management Leadership Institute for Higher Education 2016 and the Chief Executive Women's Leadership 2018.

She has had a wide range of experience serving on a number of internal and external Professional Committees and Boards. In 2009, she received an *Outstanding Professional Service Award* from the Professional Teaching Council of Western Australia for her role as treasurer for the Western Australian Institute for Educational Research (W.A.I.E.R). In 2011, her work was also acknowledged with the W.A.I.E.R Fellow Award. She was also a member of the Penrhos College Council (WA), the Western Australian University Deans of Education, and a Member of the Australian Council of Deans of Education (ACDE). In 2018, she received an Award from The Australian Council of Deans of Education in recognition of her outstanding contribution to education and the ACDE Board.

Her background is in education and innovation, in particular in the field of Information and Communication Technology (ICT). She has researched and lectured in those areas that deal with the integration and effective use of ICT in teaching and learning. In 2006 Professor Pelliccione was awarded a Carrick Australian Award for University Teaching citing her outstanding contributions to student learning for her work into ePortfolios as part of the development of critical and reflective teachers. Her research interests include: the adoption and implementation of ICT in teaching and learning; enhancing learning through the use of ICT; teacher education; online learning; innovation and change. She has been successful in obtaining internal and external funding in these areas.
